

Four major causes of mental clutter.

Our environment creates calm or clutter and gets in the way of our peace.

Philippians 4: 8-9 "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. 9 Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you."

Clutter within the digital space creates unhealthy balances.

According to Psychology Today "feeling stressed by a cluttered inbox is enough to cause anyone's mental hygiene to deteriorate..."

The people in your life should add positivity to your life, not create toxic negativity.

De-cluttering the distractions in our lives is essential for renewing our minds.

Most people waste at least an hour a day. This means more than 2 months a year you are wasting.

Clearing your mind and refocusing on purpose and plans is essential for mental clarity.

Dear Circleville Community Church,

As 2025 begins we start with the words of Jesus echoing "Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people!" (MATTHEW 4:19) How do we fish for people in today's changing world? What has become obvious is, we are not the same church, we were prior to the pandemic. We as a congregation have aged, priorities of the culture around us have changed, and society has shifted. The way in which we share the good news of Jesus with the world needs to change. The way we have always done church has to shift. People with young children are struggling with priorities more now than ever. People of all ages continue to need the love and saving message of Jesus.

We, the church, must shift and change with the world. This is not to say we are changing our values, or standards. No, quite the opposite, we are doing what Jesus does best. We are meeting people where they are and building relationships with them through discipleship, outreach and mission. Remember, Jesus has not changed; He is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow.

We must create discipleship pathways that meet people where they are, including both our current congregation and people who have yet to come. Discipleship is a lot like a tree; the trunk of the tree is our connectedness to God, the roots are our growth, the branches and leaves (fruit) are the way we serve, give, and reach out. Discipleship is a lifelong process that is both active and passive. As a church, we must meet people where they are in the process, help them to connect to God, grow those deep roots, and sprout expansive branches that produce fruit.

As leaders, the Church Council and Staff Parish made some hard decisions regarding the direction our church would go in the future. To meet people where they are in Circleville, and in greater Pickaway County, we need to make some adjustments to the way we do things at Circleville Community UMC.

- 1. We need focus and vision. In the next few weeks, we will have a vision event on January 26th for you, the congregation, to come and hear the new vision, see the strategic plan we have in place and ask questions regarding how you might be part of the process.
- 2. We have evaluated each staff position asking how they fit within a discipleship pathway. While outreach is an important piece to discipleship, it is only one part of discipleship. Church Council and Staff Parish as well as the Pastor felt it was necessary to shift this role to a more comprehensive role for the church.
- 3. We are hiring a part time Director of Youth Ministry. This should be completed by February 2025. Currently Pastor Marie, Levi Graf and several other laity are serving the Youth of the church. This ministry has grown in the last year from about 3 students to 10.
- 4. A new position, Director of Congregational Engagement, has been developed which encompasses discipleship pathway, missions and outreach.
- 5. The Outreach Director position will move to a new role beginning January 1, 2025, with a 45 day transition period.

What does this mean for our connection to the community? We will continue to serve the community through the Compassion Office, on various boards, and through the Corner Closet. This new role will help the Tree of Discipleship grow. This role will engage the congregation in connecting with serving and growing opportunities. This does mean that other community agencies will be responsible for things that our current Outreach Director is doing. For example, furniture removal, doctor's appointments etc. We realize this may take some time, therefore a transition period of 45 days to accommodate these logistics is necessary.

We are excited to see where and how Community UMC will grow and flourish. God's vision for our church is to reach new people helping them and existing people know and experience God's love and then share that love with others. Please keep our church in your daily prayers.

You can expect an update from me or the Director of Congregational Engagement monthly through email or on our website through a video message.

I look forward to seeing what God does in 2025!
